- 1. Call Policy Committee Meeting to Order** – Chair Jason Graham  
Chair Graham called the meeting to order at 6:00pm.
- 2. Pledge of Allegiance**  
Chair Graham led the pledge of allegiance.
- 3. Roll Call and Determination of Quorum** – Mr. Connor Anderson  
Mr. Anderson conducted roll call and determined a quorum present.
- 4. Approval of the April 17, 2023, Policy Committee Agenda (ACTION ITEM)**  
Motion was made to approve the April 17, 2023, Policy Committee agenda.

**5. Public Involvement**

*Comments and questions from members of the public are welcome at this time. Staff will also read comments submitted by the public prior to the meeting.*

Fran Larkins, a resident of the Celebrate VA community, expressed her appreciation on the research for more river crossing options, but noted her wish for completely restarting the effort. She noted that constructing a river crossing that would connect to Celebrate VA would divide the Celebrate community. Ms. Larkins suggested that a bridge be built further west. She also requested to not build an interchange at Gordon Shelton Boulevard and I-95, because of the inundation of freight trucks.

Randy Bruce, a resident of Celebrate VA, questioned the cost of constructing a new river crossing, saying that the cost seems low. He also mentioned reexamining the project to get a greater sense of cooperation with Spotsylvania County which could provide more options outside of the current study area.

Pamela Taylor, a resident of Celebrate VA, spoke in support of a river crossing, just not along Celebrate VA Parkway.

Matthew Shilts, a resident of Spotsylvania County, spoke in favor of a river crossing option west of I-95 on Celebrate VA Parkway, but suggested that freight trucks not be allowed to utilize this route. He also mentioned the need for safety as well as bicycle and pedestrian paths.

Joe Brito, a resident of Stafford County, spoke in favor of a river crossing and noted that he represents over 4,600 people who signed petitions for an inner connector. He supports options 2 and 4 and suggests there should be a trail connecting both sides of the river. He pointed out the survey results from the East-West Mobility Study Roadway report: 78% of the 1, 285 people surveyed support a river crossing.

John C., a resident of Celebrate VA, spoke about the traffic data and proposed that the number of vehicles will exceed the design capacity of Celebrate VA Parkway. He also noted the environmental impact for the river crossing options.

Joe Bonds, a resident of Celebrate Virginia, suggested more public engagement efforts be made to inform the public in the surrounding areas where the options for a river crossing are being investigated. Mr. Bonds also noted his wish that the options be reconsidered.

FAMPO staff read aloud an email received from Wilson Greenlaw who shared his support for a new river crossing.

## 7. Action/Discussion Items

- a. Fredericksburg Train Station Platform and Bridge Rehabilitation Project Update – Clark Construction

Chief Engineer, Dallas Richards, provided a brief update on the bridge rehabilitation project just outside of the GWRC building. Mr. Richards reviewed the construction underway that will involve extending the train platform for a longer loading and unloading area, a new set of stairs built behind the GWRC building, and improved signage, paint, and canopies. Mr. Richards noted that they are three months into a twenty-four-month calendar of projects.

b. FAMPO Vision Plan & Projects – Mr. Ian Ollis and Mx. Colie Touzel

Mr. Ollis presented an update on the FAMPO Vision plan and requested committee members discuss each objective and their policies and projects to have a regional outlook and consensus for developing a Vision plan.

Upon discussion, committee members suggested the Vision have a focus with specific priorities for the region, noting that a Vision plan needs to have a regional outlook, instead of prioritizing individual jurisdiction's constituents. Additionally, committee members suggested that FAMPO staff create a map that shows the region's comprehensive plans without jurisdiction boundaries, as well as new building rezonings, by-rights, and transportation count data. Then, committee members can view the region's projects in the context of ongoing regional development.

c. New River Crossing Update – Mr. Ian Ollis & Dr. John Ridout

Mr. Ollis provided an overview of five potential options for a new river crossing. Utilizing StreetLight data, maps were created to show vehicle trip origins and destinations. Option 1 would add a slip lane from I-95 to Central Park, using I-95 local lanes for the bridge. Option 2, Option 3, and Option 5 were developed using identified easement restrictions that are expected to yield similar benefits to Option 4, while also minimizing the impact to residential housing areas. Option 2 connects mixed-use, higher density segments of Celebrate VA to Gordon Shelton Blvd with a direct connection to Commerce Parkway. Option 3 connects Commerce Parkway to Greenbank Rd. Option 4 was previously identified within the East-West Mobility Study and connects the terminus of Celebrate VA Parkway to Gordon Shelton Blvd. Option 5 connects Commerce Parkway to an improved Greenbank Rd to Gordon Shelton/Fall Hill Avenue.

d. Resolution 23-18 Directing a Public Comment Period for the Allocation of Fiscal Year 2024-2029 Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality (CMAQ), Surface Transportation Block Grant Program (STBG), Carbon Reduction Program (CRP) and Highway Improvement Program (HIP) Funds (**ACTION ITEM**)

1. CMAQ/STBG Draft Scores – Mr. John Ridout

A motion was made to direct a public comment period for the allocation of FY24-29 CMAQ/STBG funds.
